This unique piece in a series is from Andy Warhol's early work. The watercolour over an offset lithograph illustrates the artist's illustrative working method in the late 1950s. "A Gold Book" can thus be interpreted as a reference to Warhol's work as a graphic designer and illustrator for fashion and lifestyle magazines such as Harper's Bazaar and Vogue.

In the mid-1950s, Warhol began to incorporate pictures of everyday American consumer life into his artwork. In 1956, the Museum of Modern Art took notice and invited Andy Warhol to its first major group exhibition.
